

# Guidelines and Criteria for Washington State New School Nurse of the Year Award

### **Purpose**

To publicly recognize a School Nurse who is within the first 18 months of School Nursing practice who demonstrates excellence in practice and leadership in school health.

### **Eligibility**

- 1. Nominee must:
  - a. Be a registered professional nurse
  - b. Be a current member of SNOW/NASN
  - c. Currently practice as a school nurse for 18 months or less
  - d. Spend more than 50% of work time providing direct care
  - e. Show evidence of excellence in school nursing practice based on NASN Framework for the 21st Century School Nursing Practice™.

### Procedure for Submission of Application

- 1. Nominations should include:
  - a. Completed nomination form
  - b. Up to two supporting letters of recommendation (*letters may be provided by nurses, principals, teachers, community members, or anyone familiar with the nurse's practice*):
    - i. Letters should describe specific issues or topics related to the nominee's qualifications for the award using NASN's School Nursing Practice Framework the https://www.nasn.org/nasn-resources/framework the https://www.nasn.org/nasn-resources/f
    - ii. Letters should directly reflect areas of rating that writer wishes to emphasize
    - iii. Local and State acronyms must be spelled out when used for the first time.
  - c. Completed nomination packet and supporting documents must be submitted electronically to the Awards Chair listed on the SNOW webpage under Awards by March 1st for recognition at the Spring Conference.

## <u>Criteria for Selection- based on NASN Framework for the 21st Century School Nursing Practice™.</u>

- 1. Facilitates normal development & positive student response to intervention
- 2. Provides leadership in promoting health and safety including a healthy environment (this may include legislative advocacy, research, and/or program management).
- 3. Provides quality health care & intervenes with actual & potential health problems
- 4. Uses clinical judgment in providing case management services
- 5. Actively collaborates with others to build student & family capacity for adaptation, self management, self advocacy & learning.

### Selection and Award Procedures

- 1. Nominations must be received by the Awards Chair by March 1st..
- 2. The Awards Chair and the New School Nurse of the Year Committee will review and score the nomination.

- 3. Selection of the award recipient will be announced by the New School Nurse of the Year Committee before the annual SNOW Spring Conference.
- 4. The SNOW President will telephone the selected candidate for official notification.
- 5. The Awards Chair will present the award at the annual SNOW Spring Conference.
- 6. The Washington State New School Nurse of the Year will earn free registration to the SNOW Spring Conference and a recognition plaque.
